APGO EDUCATION FOUNDATION FUNDED QR CODES GO LIVE AT METCALFE GEOHERITAGE PARK, ALMONTE, ONTARIO

August 15, 2017, Toronto, Ontario: The APGO Education Foundation ("the Foundation") is pleased to announce that the QR code system at the Metcalfe Geoheritage Park, Canada's first municipal Geoheritage Park, is now live. The QR code system is signage that enables visitors with mobile devices to connect digitally with a wealth of geo-information about the site and the specimens on display. The Metcalfe Geoheritage Park is located on the Mississippi River in the town of Almonte in eastern Ontario. The Foundation provided a grant of \$4,166 to the Metcalf Geoheritage Park Committee to support implementation of the QR code system (see press release September 19, 2016).

The geo-information accessible through the QR codes includes:

- Specimen descriptions with "look fors" that will help visitors see the features that allow geoscientists to unravel Earth's remarkable history;
- Photos that highlight specific geological features; and
- Explanations of the unique environments and geological processes that created each rock.

Dr. Bill Pearson, P.Geo., Chair of the Foundation, commented: "We are delighted to see the QR code project at the Metcalfe Geoheritage Park completed and fully operational. We congratulate the Metacalfe Geoheritage Park Committee led by Mr. Neil Carleton on a terrific job of delivering exciting and interactive geoscience information to the public. This project will help further our mission to enhance public knowledge of geoscience. We believe that the innovative approach of QR coding rock and mineral specimens at the park can become a prototype for use at other geoheritage/rock garden parks in Ontario to make high quality, locally based, geoscience information more readily accessible to the public."
