APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN FOR GEOSCIENCE STUDENTS FOR THE ANNUAL APGO EDUCATION FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

March 24, 2026, Toronto, Ontario: The APGO Education Foundation (“APGOEF”) is pleased to announce the opening of applications for the annual **APGO Education Foundation Scholarship** and the **Dr. Robert Hodder Memorial Scholarship** that support post-secondary students to complete the fourth year of a geoscience degree program at an Ontario university.

The Foundation will award two scholarships of \$5,000 each to two students of geoscience who, in the Spring of 2026, are on track to meet the requirements for advancement into the fourth year of a geoscience degree program that will enable completion of the knowledge requirements for professional registration as a P.Geo. in Professional Geoscientists Ontario (PGO). Applicants for the Dr. Robert Hodder Memorial Scholarship will be expected to demonstrate a passion for economic geology. The scholarship recipients will be determined by a Selection Committee formed by the APGOEF Directors and selected professional geoscience experts, and will receive the scholarships at the Annual Meeting of PGO to be held in June 2025, in Toronto.

Dr. Bill Pearson, P.Geo., Chair of the Foundation, commented: “We are very pleased to again offer these scholarships for geoscience degree program students, our future leaders in the profession of geoscience. Since the inception of our scholarship program in 2016, we have awarded 19 scholarships with a total value of \$95,000. We are also pleased to continue working with PGO to enhance mentoring of these students as they work towards their professional careers.”
